## A Note From The Pastor

'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future.' (Jeremiah 29:11)

Friends,

This well known scripture is one of my favorites. Like others, I love the positivity of the verse. But, I really love the fact that God has plans for us. I love that God tells us God has plans and God has had those plans for a while now.

God says, "I know the plans I have for you." God is not just now making those plans up for Jeremiah. God knows the plans God has had since before Jeremiah was born. 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you.' (Jeremiah 1:5)

Cindy S. Lee is a theologian and spiritual director. As part of her own prayer life, she quiets herself and asks God, "God, when you first imagined me, who did you see?"

I love that question. Not only does it acknowledge that God knows me and had hopes and plans for me as God did for Jeremiah the question provides a positive way of relating to God's call on my life.

Lee doesn't ask God where she has failed (at least not in that question). She doesn't begin her prayer time with guilt and sorrow. She asks God to allow her to see herself as God imagined her when she was in the womb.

I trust God. I do not believe even for a second that God imagined us to be anything disappointing or wicked. I believe that God imagined us with a hope and a future. I believe God sees us as we would like to see ourselves. Asking God to share God's vision of ourselves as beautiful can be a wonderful way to pray individually and as a congregation.

When God first imagined you, who did God see? When God first imagined Royster, who did God see?





## **Property Committee**

EXTERIOR PAINTING, INTERIOR REPAIRS STARTING Two contracts for maintenance/repairs have been approved by Session and awarded to contractors.

A contract to paint the exterior of the church, including the steeple; the cupola over the fellowship hall; the columns and front of the church; and the eaves and trim around the church buildings has been awarded to Azar/Old Dominion Painting. Competitive bids were received and Azar/Old Dominion was the low bidder at \$77,220. The highest quality paint will be used. The work has already started on the south end of our property as evidenced by the mobile lift. Work is expected to be completed by mid-May.

A contract to repair the ceilings in the northeast corner of the Sanctuary (by the balcony) and outside the door by the Lectern side of the church. The contract was awarded to Clarke Thrasher for \$8,106. Work is expected to be completed by the end of April. The 2024 Church Budget included \$100,000 for capital improvements including these two items of work.

The Property Ministry Team (John Keifer is the chair) has been managing these projects.



#### Devotion

#### "The Giver of Life" A Devotion for Pentecost

"I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams."— Acts 2:17

The church marks the Day of Pentecost as the birthday of the church. Some congregations mark the day with a birthday cake, something the children take to readily.

Still, if the presence and power of the Holy Spirit at that first Pentecost marks the beginning of the church, the Spirit's work was not finished on that day, since it is the Spirit who creates the church in every new generation.

For example, it is the Spirit that makes our meal of bread and cup more than a remembrance of a crucified Jesus, but a celebration of the living Christ still present among us. It is the Spirit who makes Jesus our contemporary.

Just as at that first Pentecost, when foreigners without a common language could all understand each other, it is the Spirit that gathers the church out of all sorts and conditions of people.

The church early on recognized that the Spirit that created the church on Pentecost was the same creative life-giving Spirit that hovered over the waters of chaos at the creation.

God's Spirit was there at the beginning and has never ceased God's work of enlivening and inspiring. This same Spirit "spoke through the prophets." And still speaks through a variety of people today.

So let us celebrate the birthday of the church on Pentecost, but let us also discern where God's Spirit is moving today, both in and outside the church, giving life, creating what is new, renewing what is old, and restoring what is outworn. Let us never stop praying the ancient prayer of the church: "Come, Holy Spirit, Come!"

Prayer: O God, keep sending your Holy Spirit among us, reviving us again and again!






